A BRIEF HISTORY

Junior Achievement was founded in 1919 by Theodore Vail, president of American Telephone & Telegraph; Horace Moses, president of Strathmore Paper Co.; and Senator Murray Crane of Massachusetts. Its first program, JA Company Program®, was offered to high school students on an after-school basis. In 1975, the organization entered the classroom with the introduction of Project Business for the middle grades. Since then, Junior Achievement has expanded its activities and broadened its scope to include in-school and after-school students.

JA PROGRAMS PROVEN SUCCESS

A new Ipsos survey found that nearly 1 in 5 Americans participated in Junior Achievement (JA) programs during K– 12. Of those alumni, 76% recall a JA volunteer teaching them about money, jobs, or business—and 64% remember what they learned. Over half (56%) say they're now in a career similar to that of their JA volunteer.

JA alumna Destiny Maiden's journey shows the powerful, lasting impact of JA programs.

Destiny's story began at Forest Heights Elementary with JA in a Day. In middle school, she experienced JA Finance Park at McKinley, and by high school, she was paying it forward teaching JA in a Day at Ryan Elementary as a DECA club member. She also competed in the Trust Your Crazy Ideas Challenge, winning both the local and state competitions.

Today, Destiny works at Southern Teachers & Parents Federal Credit Union and continues to give back as a community mentor. Her full-circle JA story is a powerful reminder of the difference your support makes in the lives of young people.

JA in a Day is a Junior Achievement (JA) program that delivers lessons to an entire grade level in a single day. The program aims to inspire and educate students about the connection between education and workplace success, and to help them understand how to make choices to meet their needs and wants. JA-in-a-Day programs include practical information about earning, saving, and sharing money.



JA BizTown and JA Finance Park blend classroom learning with a hands-on visit to a Discovery Center Mobile site. At JA BizTown, students run businesses, manage local government, vote for a mayor, and handle personal finances. At JA Finance Park, they're assigned a job and income, then build a monthly budget by exploring real-life expenses like housing, transportation,






